# Camp Wyanokie



Nestled in the hills of West Milford, NJ, Camp Wyanokie was gifted to the towns of Caldwell, Fairfield, North Caldwell, Roseland and West Caldwell so residents could enjoy the wonders of nature. The camp's 150 wooded acres surround the sparkling waters of it's 5 acres lake, and welcomes campers with lean-tos, tent sites, group pavilion, latrine facilities, drinking water, and ample parking. Camp Wyanokie is also the ideal place for a day trip full of fishing, hiking, birding and picnicking. Camp Wyanokie is YOUR camp to enjoy.



**CAMPING:** This is the perfect place for groups large and small to get back to nature and enjoy the camping experience. Pitch your tent or stay in one of the lean-tos. The "Lions Den" pavilion is great to use as a group meeting place. The camp offers plenty to do during the day before you toast those marshmallows around the campfire and snuggle into your sleeping bag for the night. It's an ideal place for Scouts, and familys.



Adjacent to the 4,210 acres of Norvin Green State Forest the camp is your gateway to explore miles and miles of marked hiking trails that take you through the areas uniquely beautiful landscape up to panoramic views that show as far as the New York skyline 35 miles away. With it's diversity of habitat this is a paradise for those looking to do bird watching, and study the areas plant and animal life. Why not grab a trail map and experience both the serenity and exhilaration of the forest. Don't forget your camera!

**NATURALLY:**



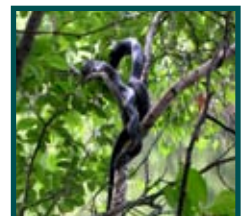

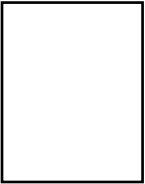

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**DIRECTIONS:** ROUTE 23 north to a right turn onto ECHO LAKE ROAD (approximately 15 miles from Rt. 80 interchange). ECHO LAKE ROAD for 2.2 miles to a left turn onto MACOPIN ROAD. MACOPIN ROAD for 1.9 miles just past the West Milford H.S. (on the right) to a right turn onto WEST BROOK ROAD. WEST BROOK ROAD for 0.7 miles to fork (service station); bear left at fork (Otter Road bears right); continue on WEST BROOK ROAD for another 1.4 miles to a right turn onto SNAKE DEN ROAD, (just past Kitchell Lake and Kitchell Lake Drive East on the left). Follow SNAKE DEN ROAD, which begins as a paved road and becomes a gravel road, to CAMP WYANOKIE, approximately 3/4 miles.
